AFL SEASON 2023 AN AMAZING MELBOURNE MONTH

With a special record set during the first four rounds of Season 2023, our roving reporter (committee member Mark Jenkins) reviewed the games, the achievements and the challenges along the way.

After four rounds, our Demons were 3 and 1, following a solid win against the Western Bulldogs in the first round (by 50 points), against Sydney (Round 3, by 50 points) and more recently over West Coast (in Round 4 by doubling WC's score to win by 63 points!). Our only loss to date was by 11 points to the Brisbane Lions in Queensland - sometimes played with the lights on!!

All wins in the first month of the game were by 50 points or more, which is a first ever for the club, and a special achievement for the entire team.

Round 1 saw the Demons at the MCG for the first time in 2023, and, after a couple of good performances in the pre-season, expectations were high. Following a tight first half, the Demons exerted their control on our home ground, and ran out easy 50 point winners.

Round 2 was played between the Demons and Brisbane Lions in sunny Queensland. Unfortunately, all the sun in the world couldn't help the game's progress when during the lights went out early in the fourth quarter. At that time, the Lions were 40 points up and didn't look to be pressured. But, in a turnaround of fortunes after the game was resumed (following the restoration of power!), it was the Demons who came out to play, and by the time the final siren sounded, had reduced the margin to just 11 points.

As a sad footnote to this game, our captain and the AFL's most dominant ruckman - Max Gawn - was struck down with a knee injury. While a scan would later show it was a strained MCL rather than the dreaded ACL, the unfortunate news was that Max will still miss the next 6 to 8 weeks.

Round 3 saw the Demons return to the MCG to play the Sydney Swans. Balancing on one win and a loss, it was an ideal opportunity for the team to regain momentum and revisit the winners' list. After a tough tussle over the first three quarters, the Demons got into a winning rhythm and glided to a 50-point win. Newcomer Jacob van Rooyen impressed with three goals on debut.

Thankfully, after the main break our boys switched their performance up a gear, and broke away to finish the term 49 points up. The third quarter run by the Demons has become a real highlight of their playing style, and is something that supporters look forward to with a great sense of anticipation.

An equally dominant last quarter saw the Demons run out winners by 63 points, doubling West Coast's score. For those supporters who made the journey from the east coast to cheer



on the team next to their Perth based colleagues, their commitment to the club was duly rewarded!

ANZAC EVE

When you look up into the night skies above the MCG on Anzac Eve, take a moment to be part of a very special anniversary, linking all of us way back beyond 2023 and the everyday.

This year, the Melbourne Football Club is particularly honouring Keith 'Bluey' Truscott, marking the eightieth anniversary of his death. An air ace who flew in the Battle of Britain, he truly was one of 'the few'. He was also one of ours: 50 games, a dual premiership player in his No. 5, a former Melbourne High boy.

'Bluey' returned to play one last game in 1942, and turned 26 before heading to Western Australia, where he continued defending home skies. He was something special, was our 'Bluey',



in more ways than his Distinguished Flying Cross (and bar) and Mentioned In Despatches honours indicate. It was unfathomable that, less than a year later

– 28 March 1943 – we lost him, killed as he flew into the sea while on a training run over Exmouth Gulf.

But, in the sad and sorrowful months that followed, the Truscott legacy was firmly embedded in the story of the Melbourne Football Club; not only for deeds done and achievements beyond belief, but for the future. 'Checker' Hughes, who loved 'Bluey' for his larger than life personality, established that the club's Best and Fairest should be named in his honour. It has been that way for all the seasons since, and is a reminder of a player, a person and a pilot.

So, when you hear his name on Anzac Eve, when you see the team running out onto the ground, and when the lights shine brightly after dark and remembering silence, think of 'Bluey', long gone, but never forgotten.
